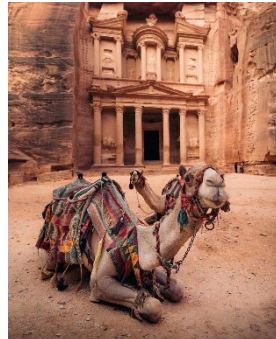

DAY 01: ALLENBY BRIDGE – MOUNT NEBO – MADABA – PETRA

Upon arrival at Allenby Bridge, our representative will meet you and will assist you with visa arrangements and passport checking. Your driver will be waiting for you and will take you to visit **Madaba**. Known as the “City of Mosaics”, Madaba is the cultural epicenter for Byzantine and Umayyad mosaics. Just a short distance from the capital, visitors are just a stone’s throw away from the holy monuments of religious iconography. Proceed to and explore Mount Nebo which is significant because of its role in the Old Testament. The Bible says that Mount Nebo was where Moses lived out his final days and saw the Promised Land, which he would never enter. It is believed he ultimately died nearby. “Then Moses went up from the plains of Moab to Mount Nebo, the headland of Pisgah, across from Jericho, and the Lord showed him all the land.”(Deuteronomy 34:1). Lunch at a local restaurant and hotel in Petra overnight.

DAY 02: PETRA VISIT – AMMAN

Breakfast at the hotel, explore the ancient city of **Petra**, one of Jordan's national treasures and by far its best-known tourist attraction. Petra is the legacy of the Nabataeans, an industrious Arab people who settled in southern Jordan more than 2,000 years ago. Admired then for its refined culture, massive architecture and ingenious complex of dams and water channels, Petra is a UNESCO World Heritage Site and one of the new Seven Wonders of the World. Inhabited by the Nabateans, Edomites and Romans, Petra brought together the knowledge and skill of these civilizations to create this world wonder. Caravans laden with incense, silks, spices and other exotic goods would rest at Petra. Lunch at local restaurant, head to Amman, transfer to your hotel for overnight.

DAY 03: AMMAN AIRPORT – CAIRO EGYPTIAN MUSEUM - WALKING TOUR OF EL MOEZ STREET – CAIRO

Breakfast at the hotel, transfer to Queen Alia International Airport and Upon arrival to Egypt our representative will meet you before the passport control at your terminal and take you through the immigration taking care of the visa arrangements and passport checking. Your driver will be waiting for you outside the airport to take you to your hotel in Cairo. After that we will head to **Egyptian Museum**, located in the heart of Cairo, the Egyptian Museum is the Middle East's oldest archaeological museum and one of Egypt's most popular touristic destinations. The museum houses a vast collection of ancient Egyptian antiquities in its unique neo-classical building, spanning from the Predynastic period to the Greco-Roman period. Proceed to **El-Moez Street** is one of the oldest streets in Egypt's capital and an eloquent witness to history, with various monuments spread along both its sides. After that we head to **Khan El Khalili**; No visit to Cairo is Complete without a stop at the Khan El-Khalili bazaar, where you will be transported back in time to an old Arab souk. Shop owners calling you to their stalls, the scent of spices, the hustle and bustle of trade, and the many beautiful objects that can be purchased will have you lost among alleys for hours. Put your haggling skills to the test when buying statuettes, spices, souvenirs, silver jewelry, t-shirts, gallabiyahs, belly dancing costumes, or anything for that matter. When your shopping's done, don't miss out on a traditional cup of tea at the famous Fishawi's cafe. Return to your hotel in Cairo for overnight.

DAY 04: FULL DAY GIZA PYRAMIDS & SPHINX, SAKKARA HIDDEN GEMS, DAHSHUR PYRAMIDS & MEMPHIS

Breakfast at the hotel, transfer to **Giza**, neighbor to Cairo and the second largest city in Egypt, located on the west bank of the Nile, home to some of the most exceptional archeological sites in the country and the world. With the Great Pyramids of Giza as its hallmark, the city is a must-visit destination to view the greatest and only one of the ancient seven wonders of the world still standing today and experience much of what the ancient Egyptian civilization has left behind. Continue to visit **Sphinx**. The greatest mystery of Ancient Egyptian mysteries is also the largest monolithic statue and the oldest known monumental sculpture in the world. When was it built, for what purpose, which pharaoh does it represent, and who broke the nose? Any answer is a matter of conjecture. Egyptologists have not found any conclusive evidence. No matter. The Great Sphinx of Giza is a wonder to behold. Visit **Saqqara Step Pyramid**, said to be the world's oldest monumental masonry structure, the unique pyramid of Djoser in Saqqara is part of a mortuary complex for the 3rd Dynasty king Djoser. Created by the architect Imhotep, it is a unique stepped pyramid with 6 tiers. The blue tiles of Djoser's tomb, and the Doors of the Cats (Abwab el Qotat) are all breathtaking scenes. Visit the Museum of Imhotep and some tombs of the Nobels, after that head to **The Red Pyramid of Dahshur**. Located at a short distance from Saqqara, the Red Pyramid at Dahshur was built for the pharaoh Snefru, father of Khufu for whom the Great Pyramid of Giza was built. The Red Pyramid is the first 'true' pyramid, and it has the second largest base of all Egyptian pyramids. What makes it yet more interesting is that it can be fully accessed, including the chance to see the burial chamber. There's something special about exploring the cold and silent passageways inside the pyramid. Do not go inside if you are not comfortable in enclosed space. Proceed to visit **Memphis and its Necropolis**. Once considered to be one of the Seven Wonders of the World, the ancient capital of Memphis is home to fascinating tombs, mastabas, temples, and pyramids. Lunch at a local restaurant, followed with free time for shopping. Return to your hotel in Cairo for overnight.

DAY 05: DEPARTURE

Breakfast at the hotel, Transfer to Cairo International airport for departure.
