DAY 01: ALLENBY BRIDGE - MOUNT NEBO - MADABA - PETRA

Upon arrival at Allenby Bridge, our representative will meet you and will assist you with visa arrangements and passport checking. Your driver will be waiting for you and will take you to visit **Madaba**. Known as the "City of Mosaics", Madaba is the cultural epicenter for Byzantine and Umayyad mosaics. Just a short distance from the capital, visitors are just a stone's throw away from the holy monuments of religious iconography. Proceed to and explore **Mount Nebo** which is significant because of its role in the Old Testament. The Bible says that Mount Nebo was where Moses lived out his final days and saw the Promised Land, which he would never enter. It is believed he ultimately died nearby. "Then Moses went up from the plains of Moab to Mount Nebo, the headland of Pisgah, across from Jericho, and the Lord showed him all the land." (Deuteronomy 34:1). Lunch at a local restaurant and hotel in Petra overnight.

DAY 02: PETRA VISIT – AMMAN

Breakfast at the hotel, explore the ancient city of **Petra** is one of Jordan's national treasures and by far its best known tourist attraction. Petra is the legacy of the Nabataeans, an industrious Arab people who settled in southern Jordan more than 2,000 years ago. Admired then for its refined culture, massive architecture and ingenious complex of dams and water channels, Petra is a UNESCO World Heritages Site and one of the new Seven Wonders of the World. Inhabited by the Nabateans, Edomites and Romans, Petra brought together the knowledge and skill of these civilizations to create this world wonder. Caravans laden with incense, silks, spices and other exotic goods would rest at Petra. Lunch at local restaurant, head to Amman, transfer to your hotel for overnight.

DAY 03: AMMAN CITY TOUR - JERASH - AMMAN AIRPORT - CAIRO

Breakfast at the hotel, visit the capital of Jordan **Amman**, Explore the downtown part of Amman for 2 hours, visiting sites and museums including the Citadel, Roman Theater, Archaeological Museum, the Folklore Museum, King Abdullah Mosque (outside visit), Bazaar & craft shops. Everywhere you look there is evidence of the city's much older past! After Amman City Tour, drive to explore **Jerash** the Pompeii of the East. You will enter Jerash through the monumental South Gate and find you wandering around in a Roman city. You will walk in the Oval Plaza surrounded by colonnades, visit the Roman theatre and Byzantine churches with mosaic-covered floors. Enjoy a stroll along Jerash' main road the Cardo and pass by the Nymphaeum. You may experience the marvelous acoustics of the theatre, the stage of the Jerash music festival which takes place every year. And see for yourself how the Romans built the earthquake-proof columns of the colonnaded streets. After that transfer to Amman queen alia international airport, and Upon arrival to Egypt our representative will meet you before the passport control at your terminal and take you through the immigration taking care of the visa arrangements and passport checking. Your driver will be waiting for you outside the airport to take you to your hotel in Cairo for overnight.

DAY 04: FULL DAY GIZA PYRAMIDS & SPHINX, SAKKARA HIDDEN GEMS, DAHSHUR PYRAMIDS & MEMPHIS

Breakfast at the hotel, transfer to **Giza**, neighbor to Cairo and the second largest city in Egypt, located on the west bank of the Nile, home to some of the most exceptional archeological sites in the country and the world. With the Great Pyramids of Giza as its hallmark, the city is a must-visit destination to view the greatest and only one of the ancient seven wonders of the world still standing today and experience much of what the ancient Egyptian civilization has left behind. Continue to visit **Sphinx.** The greatest mystery of Ancient Egyptian mysteries is also the largest monolithic statue and the oldest known monumental sculpture in the world. When was it built, for what purpose, which pharaoh does it represent, and who broke the nose? Any answer is a matter of conjecture. Egyptologists have not found any conclusive evidence. No matter. The Great Sphinx of Giza is a wonder to behold. Visit **Saqqara Step Pyramid** Said to be the world's oldest monumental masonry structure, the unique pyramid of Djoser in Saqqara is part of a mortuary complex for the 3rd Dynasty king Djoser. Created by the architect Imhotep, it is a unique stepped pyramid with 6 tiers. The blue tiles of Djoser's tomb, and the Doors of the Cats (Abwab el Qotat) are all breathtaking scenes. Visit the Museum of Imhotep and some tombs of the Nobel's, after that head to **The Red Pyramid of Dahshur** Located at a short distance from Saqqara, the Red Pyramid at Dahshur was built for the pharaoh Snefru, father of Khufu for whom the Great Pyramid of Giza was built. The Red Pyramid is the first 'true' pyramid and it has the second largest base of all Egyptian pyramids. What makes it yet more interesting is that it can be fully accessed, including the chance to see the burial chamber. There's something special about exploring the cold and silent passageways inside the pyramid. <u>Do not go inside if you are not comfortable in enclosed space</u>. Proceed to visit **Memphis and its Necropolis**. Once considered to be one of the Seven Wonders of the World, the

DAY 05: VISIT OLD CAIRO & THE CITADEL & ALABASTER MOSQUE & BAZAARS

Breakfast at the hotel, Visiting old Cairo, you will easily locate the Mohamed Ali Mosque, due to its prominent features: its dome rises up to 52 metres high and two east side minarets reach not less than 84 meters. While wandering around the mosque, you will soon discover why it also holds the name of the 'Alabaster Mosque.' Its interior and exterior walls are amazingly coated with alabaster to the height of 11 metres. The Mohammed Ali Mosque crowns the Citadel of Salah el-Din in Cairo. It was built between 1830 and 1848 by the architect Yousef Bushnak and upon Mohamed Ali Pasha's request. After that we will continue to visit Salah El-Din Citadel, one of the world's greatest monuments to medieval warfare. Resembling a typical early medieval fortress, with large imposing gateways, towers and high defending walls, the Citadel is one of Cairo's main attractions and probably the most popular non-pharaonic monument in the Egyptian capital. The prominent fortress houses three mosques - of which the impressive Mohamed Ali Mosque - a carriage museum, a military museum, and a garden museum, just to name a few, and they are all worth a visit. You are even allowed the run of the fortifications and it is worth a try: the views are spectacular from this height. The citadel is also home to the impressive Gawhara Palace (the Jewel Palace), named after Gawhara Hanem, Mohamed Ali's last wife. Built in 1814, it housed the ruler's administration and was used as a personal residence by the Egyptian leader. Beautiful gold inscriptions adorn the walls of this majestic Ottoman-influenced palace. One of its most eccentric components is the Watch Hall, where the shape of a watch has been used to decorate the walls. After that we will visit Coptic Cairo, exploring the magnificent churches, including the Hanging church take the steps that lead to one of the most beautiful churches in the Middle East known as the Hanging Church. Built on top of the Roman fortress gatehouse called Babylon, the nave of the Hanging Church is suspended over the passageway. Located just south of the Coptic Museum in Cairo, the Hanging Church boasts 13 magnificent pillars in its interior, representing Jesus and his 12 apostles. Listen in on the ancient liturgical Coptic language used in service and witness a living vestige of Ancient Egyptian history. The Church of St Barbara, a small and historically significant church near Abu Serga, the Church of St. Barbara, or "Sitt Barbara" houses some interesting icons and the relics of the Saint herself, who was murdered by her father after attempting to convert him to Christianity. Many of the treasures of this ancient church can now be found in the Coptic museum which is a two minute walk away. Built between the 4th and 5th centuries this church retains a beautiful ambience owing to the artful icons and its breathtaking Coptic architecture. While visiting this holy place please be sure to dress modestly. Lunch at local restaurant, return to your hotel in Cairo and overnight.

DAY 06: CAIRO – LUXOR VISIT EAST BANK

Breakfast at the hotel, you'll take your flight from Cairo to Luxor you will visit The **Karnak** Temple Complex is home to three main temples, several smaller enclosed temples, and a number of outer temples - combining the achievements of many generations of ancient builders over a period of 1500 years. Around thirty different pharaohs contributed to the building process of this site, enabling it to reach a size, complexity and diversity not seen elsewhere. It was after all the New Kingdom's most sacred site. The Ancient complex covers a total area of 2 sq. km, and its name \"Karnak\" means \"fortified settlement\" in Arabic. The temple of Amun, the complex's main structure, is the largest place of worship ever built. It is surrounded by two other gigantic temples, dedicated to Amun's wife, Mut and his son, Khonsu, respectively Although it might seem badly ruined today, there are still many features to Karnak that make it one of the largest and most impressive of all ancient sites in Egypt. Lunch at local restaurant, after that transfer to your hotel Overnight in Luxor.

DAY 07: VISIT LUXOR WEST BANK

Breakfast at the hotel, you will start your tour to the west bank of Luxor start with the **Valley of the Kings** Situated on the ancient site of Thebes, on Luxor's West Bank, the Valley of Kings is the ancient burial ground of many of Egypt's New Kingdom rulers. A truly impressive site! There, you will find Tutankhamen's tomb which was discovered almost intact in 1922 and the tomb of Ramses IV, among others. A ticket will allow you to visit 3 of the 63 tombs on site, except Tutankhamen's tomb, which requires an additional ticket. Although the tomb alone is worth a visit, you will have to visit the Egyptian Museum in Cairo to see the treasures Tutankhamen was buried with. After that head to the **Temple of Hatshepsut** Located beneath massive cliffs near the west bank of the Nile, the Mortuary Temple of Hatshepsut, also known as Deir el Bahri, is dedicated to Amon-Ra, the sun god. Designed by an architect named Senemut, the temple is unique because it was designed like classical architecture. Note the lengthy, colonnaded terrace some of which are 97 ft high, pylons, courts, and hypostyle hall. Inside you'll see the sun court, chapel and sanctuary. Temple reliefs depict the tale of the divine birth of Hatshepsut and trade expeditions to the Land of Punt (a reference to modern Somalia or the Arabian Peninsula). Lunch at local restaurant, transfer to your hotel in Aswan for overnight.

DAY 08: VISIT ABU SIMBEL TEMPLE & EXPLORING PHILAE ISLAND

Breakfast at the hotel, head to visit **Abu-Simbel**. The very small village of Abu-Simbel lies 280 km south of Aswan, and only 40 km north of the Sudanese border. Even though it is home to several hotels, the small town is usually overlooked by tourists as a holiday destination. Most of them prefer to visit the Nubian town on a daytrip from Cairo or Aswan or as an extension to a Nile cruise or a Lake Nasser Cruise. Perched atop a hill overlooking the Nile, the majestic Abu-Simbel Temples are a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Dedicated to Ramses II & Nefatari, the world-famed temples will take your breath away. After this visit return to Aswan, Lunch at local restaurant, then visit another landmark the **temple of Philae**, dedicated to the goddess Isis, the Temple of Philae is located in a beautiful setting, landscaped to match the original site of the temple when it was relocated by UNESCO after the building of the Aswan Dam threatened the site. The temple has several shrines and sanctuaries such as Trajan's Kiosk or Pharaoh's Bed. After that return to your hotel, overnight in Aswan.

DAY 09: FROM ASWAN TO CAIRO

Breakfast at the hotel, take flight to Cairo, transfer you to your hotel and overnight.
